SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE ORDER

SUBJECT: Facilities

AUTHORITY: 10 USC §§ 2686, 2802, 2803, 2805, 2807, 2809, 2810, 2811, 2853, 2854, 2854a, 2855, 2857, 2858, 2862, 2864, and 2867

1. Delegation of Authority to Sell Utilities and Related Services.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2686 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 1a may be further re-delegated.

2. Delegation of Authority to Carry Out Military Construction Projects.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2802 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 2a may be further re-delegated.

3. Delegation of Authority to Carry Out Emergency Construction Projects.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2803 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 3a may be further re-delegated.

4. Delegation of Authority to Carry Out Unspecified Minor Military Construction Projects.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2805 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 4a may be further re-delegated.

5. Delegation of Authority with Respect to Architectural and Engineering Services and Construction Design.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2807 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 5a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

c. The authority under 10 USC § 2807(a) re-delegated under subparagraph 5b may be further re-delegated.

6. Delegation of Authority for Long-Term Facilities Contracts.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2809 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 6a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

7. Delegation of Authority for Environmental Restoration Projects.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2810 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 7a may be further re-delegated.

8. Delegation of Authority to Repair Facilities.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2811 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 8a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

c. The authority re-delegated under subparagraph 8b may be further re-delegated, but such re-delegation shall not extend to any project costing more than \$5,000,000 for all phases.

9. Delegation of Authority to Vary Costs in Construction Projects.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2853 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 9a may be further re-delegated.

10. Delegation of Authority to Repair, Restore, or Replace Damaged or Destroyed Facilities.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2854 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 10a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

c. The authority re-delegated under subparagraph 10b may be further re-delegated, but such re-delegation shall not extend to any project costing more than \$1,500,000 or more than \$100,000 in the case of a military family housing unit.

11. Delegation of Authority to Convey Damaged or Deteriorated Military Family Housing.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2854a is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 11a may be further re-delegated.

12. Delegation of Authority to Make Estimates Relating to Architectural and Engineering Contracts.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2855 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 12a may be further re-delegated.

13. Delegation of Authority Relating to Renewable Forms of Energy in New Facilities.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2857 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 13a may be further re-delegated.

14. Delegation of Authority on Use of Funds to Expedite a Construction Project.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2858 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 14a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

15. Delegation of Authority to Use Turn-Key Selection Procedures.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2862 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 15a may be further re-delegated.

16. Delegation of Authority Relating to Construction Contracts on Guam.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2864 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 16a may be further re-delegated.

17. Delegation of Authority to Sell Electricity from Alternate Energy and Co-generation Facilities.

a. The authority vested in the Secretary of the Air Force under 10 USC § 2867 is hereby delegated to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics).

b. The authority delegated in subparagraph 17a may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations).

18. Re-delegation to the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics). Any authority re-delegated by this Order to the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics) may be re-delegated by the Assistant Secretary to the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics), without authority to re-delegate.

19. General Rules Governing Re-delegations. Re-delegations of authority under this Order may only be made to the extent this Order expressly authorizes such re-delegation. Any re-delegation of authority made pursuant to this Order shall not be effective unless it is in writing. No re-delegation shall occur by implication. Re-delegations to a level below that of Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations) may be made by Air Force Instruction. Any person re-delegating authority in accordance with this Order may further restrict or condition the authority being re-delegated.

20. Notifications to Congress. No re-delegation of authority under this Order to a level below that of Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations) shall include authority to provide notifications or reports to Congress.

21. Secretary of the Air Force Order 715.2, *Facility-Related Authorities*, March 18, 2000, is hereby superseded.



SUBJECT: Revised Secretary of the Air Force Orders (SAFO)

The seven attached SAFOs require update/revision as a result of the establishment of the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment, and Logistics (SAF/IE) and changes in statutory and delegated authority.

The Secretary of the Air Force has divided the roles, responsibilities and authorities of the former Office of Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Manpower, Reserve Affairs, Installations and Environment)(SAF/MI), into two new offices, the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Manpower and Reserve Affairs)(SAF/MR), and SAF/IE. This organizational change was effective 13 August 2001. As a result of this organizational change, the seven SAFOs listed below need to be reissued so that the former title "Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Manpower, Reserve Affairs, Installations and Environment)" is replaced with the correct title "Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Installations, Environment and Logistics). At the same time the amended SAFOs incorporate several other changes required to reflect changes in statutory and delegated authority and make other technical corrections. These technical changes include additions or corrections necessary to correct duplicate delegations of authority, incorrect legal citations, and the addition of delegations of authority omitted inadvertently, as well as stylistic changes to further the use of a consistent style within all the SAFOs.
